However, the actual expenditure incurred varies from member to member. Also information related to salaries and other allowances, Travelling allowances and facilities (Air and Train), Telephone facilities and call usage entitlement of Members of Parliament is available on the website www.parliamentofindia.nic.in. Point No. 6: As per the Housing and Telephone Facilities (Members of Parliament) Rule, 1956 under the Members' Salary and Allowances Act, 1954, all the MPs are entitled for residential accommodation. As and when, they approach the Lok Sabha Secretariat for the same, accommodation is provided to all the MPs. No House rent allowance is admissible to MPs.

Water and Electricity

1000 Kilolitre of water and 50,000 units of Electricity (25,000 units measured on lights meter and 25,000 units measured on power meter or pooled together) per annum beginning from 1st January of every year is supplied free of cost in the residence allotted to a Member in Delhi/New Delhi and to a Member who is residing in private accommodation in Delhi.

Where both husband and wife are Members of Parliament and are residing in the same accommodation, their admissibility for supply of free electricity and water at the residence allotted to them shall be calculated separately.

The unconsumed units of electricity and water out of those otherwise admissible to a Member in any year shall be carried over to the subsequent years till his seat becomes vacant.

In case of consumption of electricity and water by a Member in excess of his entitlement for a particular year, such excess consumption of electricity and water shall be adjusted from the units of electricity and water in kilolitre available for the next year.

In case the seat of a Member becomes vacant due to his resignation or completion of term, he will be entitled to consume the balance units of electricity and water as available for that year within a maximum period of one month from the date on which his seat becomes vacant.

The family of a deceased Member of Parliament shall be entitled to consume the balance units of electricity and water in kilolitre available to such Member for that particular year within a period of one month from the date of death of that Member.

Telephone Facilities

A Member is entitled to have two telephones without payment of installation and rental charges, one at his residence or office in Delhi and the other at his usual place of residence or a place selected by him in his constituency or the State in which he resides. 50,000 local calls during a year are free to a Member on each of the two telephones.

The Housing and Telephone Facilities (Members of Parliament) Act, 1956 (as amended).

(i) A Member is also entitled to have one additional telephone without payment of installation and rental charges either at his residence in Delhi/New Delhi or at his usual place of residence or at the place selected by him within the State in which his constituency is or in the State in which he resides and 50,000 free local calls during a year are allowed on that telephone for internet connectivity purposes.

(ii) The above mentioned 50,000 free local calls admissible on each telephone can be clubbed together which comes to 1,50,000 local calls in a year.

(iii) A Member may use any number of telephones for availing the above-mentioned 1,50,000 free local calls subject to the condition that the telephones are in the name of Member and the installation and rental charges of additional telephones are borne by the Member himself.

(iv) A Member is also entitled to one mobile phone connection of MTNL and another mobile phone connection of MTNL/BSNL or any private mobile operator, in case MTNL/BSNL services are not available, with national roaming facility for utilisation in the constituency and the calls made from these telephones may be adjusted from the above-mentioned 1,50,000 calls available to them on 3 telephones. However, the registration and rental charges for private mobile phone connection are borne by the Member himself.

(v) In case a Member makes calls in excess of admissible free local calls in a year, the excess calls can be adjusted from the calls available to him on three telephones for the next year. Further, the unutilised telephone calls of a year are carried over to the subsequent years till the seat of a Member becomes vacant.

(vi) A Member is also entitled to avail broadband facility from MTNL/BSNL on any one of the above-mentioned three telephones subject to the condition that the Government may pay upto Rs. 1,500 per month towards the charges of this facility directly to MTNL/BSNL.

4. Transport Facilities

The Members are also being provided the following facilities—

(i) Ferry Vehicles through Transport Desk

There is a Transport Desk from where vehicles are provided to facilitate the Members to go from Parliament complex to their

residences and vice-versa in New Delhi. The transport facility is provided to all Members of Parliament between their residences and Parliament House Complex on a payment of a token amount of Rs. 5/- for each trip.

(ii) Rail Transport

Railway Booking and Reservation Offices function in Parliament House and near Outer Reception Office, Parliament House throughout the year for the convenience of Members of Parliament. The reservation of accommodation in trains for Members and their spouses is made from the Reservation Office, Parliament House and reservation of accommodation for Members' guests/attendants/friends etc. is made from the Reservation Office, near Outer Reception Office, Parliament House.

(iii) Air Transport

An Air Booking Office of Air India functions in Parliament House throughout the year. Arrangements also exist for Members of Parliament to book air passages with the Air India Booking Office in Safdarjung Airport, New Delhi. The booking can also be done by Members over the telephone in certain circumstances.

(iv) Taxis and Scooters Outside Parliament House Annexe

During Session Period, arrangements are made for availability of taxis and scooters at taxi Stands outside Parliament House Complex with the assistance of Delhi Police, Taxi Stands around Parliament House Complex and Watch and Ward Office Lok Sabha Secretariat.

5. Medical Facilities

(i) Members of Parliament are entitled to same medical facilities as are available to the officers of Central Civil Services, Class-I under Central Government Health Scheme.

(ii) Under the Central Government Health Scheme, as extended to Members of Parliament, a First Aid Post in the Lobby of the Central Hall of Parliament House and a Medical Centre in the basement of Parliament House Annexe function throughout the year to render First Aid to Members of Parliament and to meet the first aid requirement arising in the precincts of the Parliament House Complex.

(ii) The Medical Centre has X-Ray, Ultra Sound, ECG, Pathological Laboratory facilities and consultation in Cardiac, Dental, Ophthalmic, ENT, Gynaec, Skin, Orthopaedic, Psychiatric and Surgical Specialities. Apart from this, the services of Dietician, Paediatrician, Physiotherapist are also available on given days of the weeks. The Medical Centre maintains a record of Health status of each Member of Parliament.

B. Other Facilities to Members

(a) Diplomatic Passport

A Member and his wife/husband is eligible for the issue of Diplomatic Passport for going abroad on study tour/conference/private visit.

(b) Income Tax Sub-Office

Under arrangements made with Ministry of Finance, an Income Tax Sub-office function in Parliament House Annexa throughout the year for rendering assistance to Members of Parliament in completing their income-tax returns and in resolving their queries relating to the payment of income-tax.

(c) *State Bank of India Branches at Parliament House and Annexa*
Branches of the State Bank of India function in Parliament House and Annexa. Besides the normal banking facilities, they accept payment in respect of income-tax and other direct taxes, investment plans, etc. Safe deposit lockers have also been provided at Parliament House Annexa Branch for the convenience of Members. ATM facility is provided for the convenience of Members in Parliament House/Annexa and Parliament Library Building.

(d) Rationing Sub-Office

With the introduction of statutory rationing in Delhi, a Rationing Sub-Office opened by the Delhi Rationing Authority functions in Parliament House during the Session period for the issue of Ration Cards to Members and their families.

(e) *Kendriya Bhandar*

A branch of the Kendriya Bhandar located at 23, Mahadev Road is open from 09.30 hrs. to 18.30 hrs. for the sale of essential commodities (such as grocery, toilet and household items, textiles, watches, etc.).

(f) *NDMC Liaison Office*

A full-fledged Liaison Office of the NDMC (New Delhi Municipal Council) functions in Parliament House Annexa throughout the year to look into the complaints of Members with regard to meters installed at their residences and all other matters connected with the NDMC, including electricity and water bills of Members.

(g) *LPG Service Counter of the Oil Industry*

The Service Counter of the Oil Industry in regard to supply of LPG and rendering timely service in respect of defective, installation, etc. functions during Session period in Parliament House Annexa for the convenience of Members of Parliament.

(h) *Security arrangements in Members' residential localities*

A Special Cell has been set up by Delhi Police in the Office of the Assistant Commissioner Police, Police Station, Parliament Street, New Delhi, to assist the Members of Parliament to maintain the security of their residences. The timing of the Cell is from 0900 hours to 1900 hours daily. Members are required to inform the Cell as and when they happen to go outside Delhi to enable the Police authorities to make necessary arrangements for the security of their residences during their absence from Delhi. The Members, for any other assistance they may require from the local police, may also contact the Cell.

(i) *Army Disposal Vehicles*

Members may apply for Army Disposal Vehicles from the Ministry of Defence. The requests received from the Members are forwarded to Ministry of Defence for release of Army Disposal Vehicles from the Army Disposal Stock.

(j) *Catering Service*

Northern Railway is running MPs' Canteen in North Avenue for the convenience of Members and their guests. In South Avenue, catering services is being run by a private caterer. In Western Court Hostel, the canteen is run by the ITDC.

*1. Accommodation

- (i) Members who come to Delhi prior to publication of Notification by the Election Commission for constituting new Lok Sabha are entitled to transit accommodation.
- (ii) Accommodation in the form of a flat is free throughout the term office to a Member. However, normal licence fee @ Rs. 105 charged on bungalow.
- (iii) Sofa covers and curtains are get washed by the CPWD aft every 3 months which are provided free of cost to Member.
- (iv) Furniture to be made free of charge to the Members within the revised monetary ceiling of Rs. 60,000 in respect of durable furniture and Rs. 15,000/- for non-durable furniture. The rent for additional items of furniture shall be charged on the depreciated value of furniture.
- (v) Members of Lok Sabha or their families can retain Government Accommodation for a maximum period of one month after their retirement, resignation/removal or ceasing to be a Member Lok Sabha on payment of the same rent, if any, which they were paying immediately before the occurrence of any of the events mentioned above.
- (vi) The family of a deceased Member of Parliament may retain Government accommodation for a maximum period of six months from the date of death of such a Member.

Office Memorandum

Sub: Revision of plinth area of residential accommodation to be constructed for Central Government employees and its applicability to all Govt. Departments.

Reference this Ministry's O.M. No. 17020/2/86-W2 dated 25-8-1987 on the above subject.

In para 5 of the above O.M. scales of plinth areas for type A(I) to type EI(VI) to be followed for all future construction in General Pool houses and the houses for other Ministries/Departments to be constructed by the CPWD, houses to be constructed by the other Ministries/Departments like Defence, Railways, All India Radio, Post and Telegraph etc. were laid down. These scales of plinth area were based on the scales of pay then available for different categories of Central Government employees.

Since the scales of pay of different categories of Central Government employees have been revised w.e.f. 1-1-96 consequent to implementation of Vth Central Pay Commission's recommendations, it has been decided to prescribe revised plinth areas for type A(I) to type EI (VI) residential accommodation as per the annexure, to be followed for all future construction in General Pool houses and houses for other Ministries/Departments to be constructed by the CPWD, houses to be constructed by other Ministries/Departments like Defence, Railways, AIR, P&T etc.

OFFICE MEMORANDUM

Sub: Fixation of plinth area norms for Type-VII and Type-VIII bungalows in Lutyen's Bungalow Zone.

No definite plinth area norms had been prescribed for the Type-VII and Type-VIII bungalows which are located in the Lutyen's Bungalow Zone area, even though for the remaining categories of houses i.e. Type-I to Type-VI, specific norms have been prescribed from time to time. The existing bungalows which were mostly constructed during pre-independence period and vary greatly in terms of the size as well as ancillary facilities. In view of the changing requirement of the dignitaries now occupying these bungalows, their security considerations, additional facilities have also been created in these bungalows from time to time.

2. Subsequent to the issuance of Lutyen's Bungalow Zone construction guidelines, the matter of permitting additional construction in existing bungalows was considered in view of the increased functional requirements and also the fact that many of the Ministers, Supreme Court Judges, High Court Judges, Secretaries to the Govt. of India are often allotted bungalows below their entitlement. With the approval of Prime Minister's Office, guidelines for additional construction/upgradation of bungalows were issued vide Ministry's O.M. No.11012/2/95-WI, dated 12.4.1996.

3. The 1996 guidelines allowed office accommodation to the extent of 500 sq.ft. in each bungalow. In addition to this, an additional residential accommodation with the ceiling of 500 sq.ft. subject to overall ceiling of 4498 sq.ft. was also permitted in case the occupant was allotted a bungalow below his entitlement. Besides, security structures like guard room, PSO shed and sentry post were also allowed to be constructed.

4. It has since been decided by the competent authority, to fix norms for Type-VII and Type-VIII categories of bungalows in the Lutyen's Bungalow Zone area so that they act as a bench mark in the event of reconstruction of the existing bungalows or construction of new bungalows by way of redevelopment of existing sites.

5. The norms fixed for Type-VII and Type-VIII bungalows comprise the area permitted for main bungalow, office space, staff quarters, garages and security requirements. The details of the area to be provided for each of the above units have been given in the Annex. The total plinth area of Type-VII bungalow would come to 6889 sq.ft. in case of four staff quarters and 7319 sq.ft in case of six staff quarters. The plinth area for Type-VIII bungalow shall be 9175 sq.ft.

6. The above scales of plinth area for Type-VII and Type-VIII bungalows shall be taken as the yardstick for the purpose of reconstruction/new construction of bungalows in the Lutyen's Bungalow Zone in future.




